

Cornelia Community House

This wonderfully restored and maintained building was constructed by the CCC (Civilian Conservation Corps) in 1936. The building is an architectural gem inside and out. It is a log structure built entirely of local pine. Located at the edge of the town's park, the City of Cornelia owns it and uses it for civic gatherings and (for a fee) private events.



Notes for the photographer: A particularly nice view is from the rear of the building. Take the stairs down from the end farthest from the highway. You might find the building open – as it is often for event preparation, etc. – or you could possibly gain access to the interior by contacting City Hall 706-778-8585.

Directions: From the RR crossing in Cornelia, head south on South Main Street. At 0.2 miles make a HARD left onto Wylly Street. The Community House is one-half mile on the left. GPS Coordinates: 34°30'46.3"N 83°31'08.6"W

Interesting Fact: Camp Toccoa (“Band of Brothers”) was nearby. During the WWII years, dances were held at the Community House for soldiers stationed there.
