47 Popular Places to Photograph in Northeast Georgia

#17 Hardman Farm



Hardman Farm

This beautiful estate was owned by the family of Dr. Lamartine Hardman (hence the name) who was governor of Georgia from 1927 to 1931. It was actually built, however, in 1870 by Captain James Nichols. The State of Georgia owns it now and refers to it as "...a grand example of Italianate architecture." Fourteen of the twenty-three structures

on the property were built by the original owner in the period 1869 to 1890. You will get a guided tour of the entire farm (including the remarkable dairy barn from the 1920's) for an entrance fee of \$12 per adult. Reservations suggested: 706/878-1077. Across the roadway is the much photographed Nacoochee Mound, an Indian burial site.

Notes for the photographer: There are hundreds of great photographic opportunities on the grounds and in the buildings (don't miss the huge barn) but I liked this view - from just inside the fence near the parking area - because it captures the Italianate house and the famous Nacoochee Indian mound across State Highway 17.

Directions: From the bridge in Helen travel 1.7 miles south on Georgia 17 to a left turn into the Hardman Farm entrance. If you go as far as the Indian mound you've gone too far. If you are coming from the south the turn into the entrance is just past the Indian Mound and intersection of Georgia 17.

GPS coordinates to the turn into the parking lot: GPS 34°41'11.4"N
83°42'37.3"W

Interesting fact: Hardman Farm was originally called "West End" because it rests on the west end of the beautiful (and largely unspoiled) Nacoochee Valley.

His images are in the permanent collections of the Metropolitan Museum, Mint Museum, New Orleans Museum of Art, High Museum of Art, Greenville (SC) County Museum of Art, Mint Museum, Asheville Art Museum, SOHO Photo Gallery, Newark Museum, and the Bank of America corporate collection. His fine art photography is represented by Lumiere Gallery in Atlanta.

His books will be available for purchase and he will be available as well for signing.
