
Best wishes to all. I am hopeful to see you in person at the November meeting.

And, finally, Daniel will announce the winner -- and present a plaque -- at the Christmas party.







Most people have never heard of the Faroe Islands.

John Martin hadn't either until he saw an article by a Danish photographer. In May of this year, he booked a flight to the Faroes.

The Faroes are a self-governed possession of Denmark. Fifty thousand Danish citizens live on the group of thirteen tiny islands. The grouping is in the North Atlantic half-way (roughly) between Denmark and Iceland.

John traveled to most of those islands over a three-week period – making photos, of course.

At the November meeting (the 15th) he will present some of those images along with a narrative about why and how he made the particular photos.
